No matter where you are on Turtle Island, which is now known as Canada and the United States, you are always on Indigenous territory. It is an important act of reconciliation to know on whose land we stand on and work together in the spirit of Treaty 13 which covers those lands. We thank the Mississaugas of the Credit and the Anishinabek First Nations for being stewards of this land and for continuing to share this land with us.

7.	Principal's report-Ms. Ferrao	 We are happy to have Mrs. Di Vito back with her class. We are happy to have Mrs. Di Vito back with her class. Stella G., has been recognized by the Philippine Consulate for her artwork that was submitted for the "Healing and Hope from Pandemic" competition. Joshua S., participated in the Skills Ontario Provincial Elementary TV-Video challenge The Day Care Centre has moved to St. Albert of Jerusalem while their space here is expanded. It is now under construction. Construction is due to be completed in the middle of August. They will be able to return once the space has been licensed by the Ministry. Note, if schools reopen before the end of this school year, we will need to lock the gate to the parking lot to ensure the health and safety of our parents and students while construction continues. (Several parking spaces have been blocked off for the construction, added congestion of cars trying to enter an exit would pose a health and safety risk). The school board started offering an Indigenous language course through night school that was well-received. They will be continuing with part 2 of that course as well as part 1 for students that are interested. In addition, anyone, regardless of age, can participate in learning Ojibway through Saturday school throughout the next school year. Families are welcome to attend together. Information about this course can be found in the May newsletter. Graduation – we have planned to have grade 8 graduation photos to be taken on June 25th, if schools are open, or at the Edge imaging studio, by appointment – if small businesses can open. Note that these can only happen if the Government and/or the Medical officers allow schools and/or small businesses to reopen. Plan B is in the works. Mr. Longo is collecting photos of the students in grade 8. He will photoshop them to prepare them to be used for a composite of the class of 2021 that Edge Imaging will print fo
