12.	Principal's report- Ms. Ferrao	Staffing changes: Ms. Notaro's leave has been extended for the remainder of the year. Mrs. Cicvaric will continue as her replacement. Mrs. Njoku has replaced Mrs. Thrasher. Mrs. Thrasher's family welcomed a new baby girl into their family. We have been assigned an additional ERW to work with our students. Mrs. Toubia will be here starting February 18 until the end of the year. Kinder registrations: 28 registrations – 5 asking for flex; 2 out of bounds requesting admission to St. Edith Stein Projections for 2020-2021 – 290 – hoping to see growth. We may have an additional class if these numbers are realized. Parent engagement night – was a success. Brave education provided a workshop for parents discussing the difference between conflict resolution and bullying. They showed parents the strategies that students are learning to use to support themselves as needed. Speakers: Giselle Gaylie – person with CP, spoke to the students. Giselle uses interactive technology to speak (i.e. a computer). Her message was one of hope and perseverance. Giselle has been bullied in the past but overcome different physical and emotional battles to become the success she is today. Giselle is developing her skills at becoming a public motivational presenter. Ohenewa Akuffo – distinguished DPCDSB alumnus and Canadian Olympian (Wrestling) – began Black History month with this highly motivational speaker who brought her faith to life as she shared her story about becoming a wrestler. She started by telling everyone that she is hot for God. She told students that everything she has/does is a gift from God – that when you have something that brings you joy, it is from God. She also emphasized the need to keep up her academics in order to enjoy time playing. She told students that having a gift is like having a pencil. They need to sharpen it in order to keep it. Students discovered that our athletes have to maintain good grades and discipline with a rigorous schedule of practices and competitions. They also found out that Canadian Olym

		YFA – going to hear Fr. Ricard speak on February 27 at St. Joan of Arc. Fr. Ricard is an awe-inspiring speaker who will explore Dr. Martin Luther King's dream with students. Dr. King dreamed about a day when his 'four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character'. Although much has of his dream has become a reality, there is still more work to be done. Ten of our YFAs will be able to attend this session. We are sharing transportation costs with 2 other schools so that there is no charge to students. Budget: The school paid for Brave education workshops for all grades, with 2 additional workshops for each of our Intermediate classes.
		The school will pay for transportation for the YFA to go to Fr. Ricard presentation. The school will help to defray costs for Grade 8 graduation. Past practice has been to have both the ceremony and the luncheon at Mississauga Convention Centre. The cost for this is too high with only 20 graduates. We are in the process of negotiating a price with Noble Banquet Hall in Oakville. This will mean that there will be additional bussing and DJ costs and the ceremony will have to be at the school as they want another \$700 for the ceremony
		alone. So far the costs are: Hall - \$1297.50 DJ \$452.00 Bus \$406.80 Awards \$440.00 Total \$2596.30
		We are asking if Council could cover the cost of the bus and the school will work towards defraying the costs to parents by paying for the DJ, Awards and part of the costs for the hall. We will try to keep the cost to parents as close to last year's graduation costs as possible
